Zion Nursery Center 2021-22 School Year



There are so many good stories in the book of Genesis. One of my favorites happens in the dark near the river. The story of Jacob wrestling with God all night has always hit me in the gut, because it invites us to ask our toughest questions. In Jacob's wrestling with God, or an angel, whomever this divine being is, we see the affirmation of our questioning, our doubt, our curiosity to who God is and how God might be calling us.

Over the past several weeks I have been very intentional of asking some of these tough questions of myself. Questions like - who is Jesus? What does the Bible teach us about God? What is grace? I have asked myself these questions while riding my bike, mowing, during Zoom meetings, and walking. Questions like - are we moving in the right direction with ministry and outreach? What will our next chapters together entail and reveal?

When I put my questions and thoughts in context with questions like were being asked in the book of Genesis an interesting revelation comes to light. At least it has for me. Maybe by thinking and engaging in your own questions and thoughts you might feel the same after reading more of this brief article.

There is a funny thing about the Hebrew word used to describe Jacob wrestling or asking questions in the story from Genesis. The Hebrew word for "wrestle" is also the same word used for "embrace." Wrestling is intimate. There's a vulnerability in it. Maybe the great theologian John Calvin was right: to come face to face with all of our messiness, our questions, our trials and challenges, is really just coming face to face with God. Perhaps we might even carry a limp, because these intimate moments of asking questions, being embraced by God, always leave a mark.

There's another part of this story I love. Jacob was afraid of meeting his brother and had sent all his family and everyone with him across the other side of the river. This encounter happens before he crosses the river. He's by himself. There's meaning in crossing the river. In many ways, personal milestones are like crossing over the river. They're liminal spaces in which our wondering and curiosity, and faith at this particular time and place are affirmed.

First, take some time to explore those questions that are on your hearts. And then, let your soul help you find the answer. I would love to hear your questions and explore them with you as we continue down our paths together. Blessings to each of you! PJ


Does it seem like summer goes by quickly or is it just me? That means the beginning of a new school year is just right around the corner. That's why we would like to invite all
