Blue Christmas is a Western Christian tradition that happens on or around the Winter Solstice. It is about gathering with others who are grieving and struggling to find joy and hope during the season. A Blue Christmas service provides a quiet and contemplative worship service as an alternative to the more traditional gatherings. This is in honor of those who are experiencing grief and struggling with loss.

This tradition in the U.S. dates back to 1990. The services draw relatively small, intimate crowds of those mourning the loss of a loved one or a significant change in someone's life.

We invite you to join us for this year's **Blue Christmas service on the evening of December 11th beginning at 5:30 p.m.** There will be a dinner served following the gathering in the sanctuary.

The Greeters are responding very well and Rosie follows up with a reminder text or phone call. Offering and Communion with the younger kids helping is working out very well and hopefully making memories and being a big part in services.

Communion served on 1st Sunday in Advent as well as Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, which is on Sunday this year.

Council will help with Hanging of the Greens last Sunday of this month.

Blue Christmas Service on December 11th.

Completed property projects this month are increased fan speed on roof top unit to push more conditioned air to the office. Setting is now at near capacity. Can possibly adjust air vent flow reducing the amount going to the foyer. Will assess when temperature drops to see if office is warmer. Still potential to add spray insulation.

Also door to church furnace basement was removed by removing complete door frame (thanks to Larry Lewis). The cemetery plot marker grid fell into the stairs and jammed against the door. Work has started to clean up the "hut" and create permanent place to hang the marker grid.

New issues are the 2nd row of sanctuary lights do not come on (breaker suspected), SS basement receptacle only partially working, lights to "hut" are not functioning, switch is broken. Plug on food warmer is "hot" and has issues, likely need to replace cord and plug. Ron Strupp has agreed to assist with these issues.

Other issues are the main sanctuary doors need exterior painting (bare wood on weather overlap strip). The pew pads need to be cleaned, possibly ask Steve Martin to clean them. Requested that Brad inspect/service the furnaces. And a SS down spout tore off due to high winds.

Open issues are the basement formica. The handicap door, still considering a hard wire option or upgrading the remote unit. The furnace room under sanctuary dry wall/plaster ceiling is crumpling/falling down, I beam support shows major rust near the floor-potential structural concern (long term project). The north hoods on the SS hall vents need painting. And the shelter light.

Projects completed last month are the new 5 inch guttering installed on the block garage on October 7th by Chapman, the NW new gutter downspout was rerouted to drain water to the west away from the garage and SE down spout will be tied into the tile running around playground perimeter (working with Larry Lewis for the tie in). The grease trap cleaned out under the dishwasher, septic smell remediated. And the cross walk stripe was repainted (used existing paint).

There was an Endowment request from Ashley Lashley on behalf of Operation Christmas Child for \$1,500 (\$1,250 for shipping) to fund last minute needs and postage for 125 boxes.

The Chili Cookoff held October 23rd was a success and enjoyed by all who attended. Thanks to Andrea Singer, Adam Kendall, and all who worked to make it a success.

We have 22 people including 3 confirmands signed up for the Peppermint Pops concert on December 4th at 2:00 pm and a block of seats have been reserved. Carl will purchase the tickets this week and hopefully distribute them beginning next Sunday. Carl plans to purchase the tickets on his credit card and collect from the attendees without going through the church treasury. Carl will submit an accounting to the council in his next report.

The Thunderbolts Hockey are having Faith Night at their game on Friday, January 27. Carl will prepare a slide for Sunday morning and a sign-up sheet to explore interest from the congregation as he did for the Peppermint Pops.


