FROM THE PASTOR

Being a caregiver isn't easy. Caring for someone we love because that person is no longer able to care for themselves can be draining, emotionally, physically, and spiritually. The fact that we find caregiving to be

draining has nothing to do with not loving the person for whom we are caring. In fact, it's quite the opposite: it's because we love the other person so much that we find becoming their caregiver so draining.

I think of those of you in our own congregation whose primary role is no longer that of spouse, but that of primary caregiver for your own spouse. No longer is your spouse your partner in all things. No longer is your spouse the one who shares in the decision-making, who carries a certain level of responsibilities, or who is able to be present for you in the ways that only spouses and partners can.

There is a real sense of loss that comes when one spouse becomes the caregiver for the other spouse. And as with any loss, this loss brings with it profound grief. Of course, it isn't just spouses and partners who become caregivers for their significant other.

Adult children also become caregivers for their parents, and when this happens, the relationship is turned upside down. The child becomes the parent, while the parent becomes the child. There is profound grief here as well. But grief isn't the only emotion we experience when our familiar family roles shift. We end up feeling frustrated, irritable, overwhelmed, and angry. We can lose patience with the other person, wishing more than anything that he or she was the person they used to be, and that life could once again be the way that it was. And we can easily become despondent and depressed.

Circumstances such as these are simply too deep and wide for any of us to manage on our own, which is where our faith community comes in. The greatest gift we can give ourselves and the other person is the gift of reaching out for help. Remember that God did not create Adam to till the garden alone; instead, God saw that it was not good for Adam to be alone, and so God created another human being to join Adam in the Garden of Eden, to be his compassion, his confidant, his help-mate. Contrary to popular belief, reaching out for help is not a sign of weakness. Reaching out for help is, in fact, a sign of strength and of courage. God placed us on this earth to be comforters for one another. Let's remember those who might need an extra hand. Let's do our best to be the hands, feet, helpers, assistors, listeners, and compassionate hearts that are needed in so many ways and in so many places.

Rosie Bogard will meet with Steve Martin and Laura Commens to discuss the vacuums we have and which ones may need replacing.

Thanks to everyone that helped with serving communion at both Christmas Eve and Day and with the candle lighting. We had 22 poinsettia orders, all are gone but one.

Thanks to everyone that helped decorate the church and helped take down the decorations. Rosie will make a new church closing schedule for Council since new people are coming on. Rosie will continue to open the church as she gets there early to make the coffee.

There was a ZNC advisory board meeting via email on Sunday night, the Hacienda fundraiser raised \$1,544.87 plus \$25 in donations. The 2023/2024 enrollment for current students and siblings will begin February 1st 2023 and then the public enrollment will be March 1st 2023. The tuition for the upcoming year is nursery school \$100 a month and the pre k classes \$150 a month. So far there are 19 for the nursery school next year and 7 on the pre k list, current enrollment is the nursery has 19 and 20 for the pre k. There will be a hop-a-thon for Mason who died from cancer on February 21st and 22nd, his parents have a memorial fund set up for him, if anyone would like to donate give the money to Sandy Schmitt.

There will be a Bible School meeting in March.

The council reviewed the new budget for 2023. All salaries for church employees were raised by 2 1/2%. The medical insurance took and 8 1/2% increase. The property insurance went up roughly \$500. The workers comp is slightly lower than last year. The mowing budget will increase to \$3,000. The phone and internet line items will be combined. The only item without an accurate number is the defibrillator since it has had no maintenance or update for 3 or 4 years.

Property projects completed this month are the elevator (handicap lift) quotes were obtained, provided directions to continue with Murphy Elevators as even though they have increased their price to \$1,000 they are still much lower than 2 other companies contacted. Also quote received from Becker for split unit heating/ AC for office area, other quotes expected, will continue with portable heating unit in office provided by Rev. Long as needed. Also church

pew from balcony removed to allow for redesign of electronic/audio space, currently storing in quilters area on west wall, will want to retain in case balcony space is rearranged in the future. There are no new property concerns.

Projects yet to do are painting exterior sanctuary doors (wait post winter/suitable weather), SS hall north vent hoods need painting (wait post winter/suitable weather), SS formica, handicap door switch, and the shelter light.

New council member candidates are Stacy Wagner, Patrick Schroeder, and Bob Juncker. Completion of balcony project-sound and streaming equipment (Joe/Demont Anderson, Greg/Jonathan Schmitt, Kyle Hoenert).

Upcoming Lenten season is February 22nd Ash Wednesday; Wednesday Lenten services are March 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th. Having the evening meals will be discussed at the next council meeting.

Holy Week is April 2nd-9th, Maundy Thursday is April 6th, Good Friday April 7th, and Easter Sunday is April 9th.



Annual Congregational Meeting will be held following worship on February 5

of the practice that some churches still implement, the rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of a cross. Since it is exactly 40 days (excluding Sundays) before Easter Sunday, it will always fall on a Wednesday—there cannot be an "Ash Thursday" or "Ash Monday." Interestingly, the Bible never mentions Ash Wednesday—for that matter, it never mentions Lent.

Lent is intended to be a time of self-denial, moderation, fasting, and the turning away from unwanted activities and habits that someone is seeking to change or quit altogether. Ash Wednesday commences this period of spiritual discipline. We will begin our Lenten journey together this year on **Wednesday**, **February 22nd at 7:00 p.m.** We would like you to join us and commit to join us through the Lenten season on each Wednesday evening following until we reach Holy Week.




Zion Nursery Center students will be participating in Mason's Hop-A-Thon on February 21st and 22nd
