Please drop off your magazines to the front desk at Good Samaritan Home, 601 N Boeke Rd, Evansville IN 47711 Have you ever been going about your day either shopping at a store, eating at a restaurant, or maybe sitting in a waiting room when a particular song plays? For every person the song is different, but as soon as you hear it, very vivid memories from another time in your life come flooding back. Often these memories are not just a recollection of the events, but we also recall and relive the emotional experiences that accompanied those events. We likely have all had this sort of experience where music serves as a powerful catalyst for our memories.

Neurological studies have revealed there might be a reason for this. In a study on the effects of music, it was found that certain parts of the brain light up when hearing a familiar song compared to a new song. The part of the brain that was active when hearing a familiar song is the same part that is associated with creating autobiographical memories. Our brains are naturally wired to make music a foundational part of the memories that have the potential to be some of the most defining to us.

While it cannot be studied quite as cleanly as neuroscience, I think a case could be made that our souls have also been created to respond to music in foundational ways. Music has been part of the Christian experience from the beginning. For instance, it is recorded on the night of the last supper, that before going to the garden Jesus and the disciples sang a hymn. Biblical scholars think that some of Paul's writings contain samples of songs that were used by first century Christians, Philippians chapter 2 is one example of this. Just like certain songs are deeply connected to our memories, we also have songs that are deeply connected to our faith.

For some of us these songs might be rooted in memories. Perhaps it is an old hymn that you associated with the grandparents who were shining examples in faith, or perhaps it is the song that was playing when you first committed to follow Jesus. Other deep faith songs might be ones that spoke truth and reassurance into our lives when we needed it the most, or they are songs that put our most important beliefs to words in a way we cannot.

We all have songs that connect to our faith. These are songs that make God's presence more detectable to us than normal, and songs that speak to our hearts and souls like nothing else. So here is what I propose. Over the rest of the summer I invite you to email, text, call, or whatever way you might choose... send me your top 3 hymns that are the most meaningful to you personally. I will compile these responses and then use the most selected songs as part of our worship services throughout the rest of the summer. Perhaps the most meaningful songs to you will make the list, or maybe you will get the opportunity to learn some new favorite songs. Either way, may we all be able to worship in Spirit and truth over these next couple of months.

The council want to try out a volunteer program for greeters on Sunday mornings.

Nancy Lewis attended the Nursery School Advisory Committee meeting on May 15th. There were 20 graduates; the 2022 and 2023 enrollment is pre k 21, nursery 18, and they are full. The next meeting will be on August 14th at 6:00.

There will be a VBS meeting on June 16th to finalize plans.

The council agrees to give the entire Lenten offering of \$1,737 to God's Store House.

Tristate Painting has started repairs on the parsonage kitchen ceiling, it will be completed this week. An 8 ft florescent light in the west wall church window has been replaced.

The mold in the basement boys bathroom has been cleaned with bleach, still assessing best water proof paints. Would like to accomplish with in house workers, looking to scrape paint and start project within the next 30 days.

Chris McCutchan planted some trees in front of the church, and the dead holly bush in front of the Sunday school hall has been removed.

Waiting to hear back from Chapman roofing about the broken garage gutters. Still trying to fix the handicap doors.

Kelly Esche has made a request to install lights at the playground/shelter area. Probably a good idea to minimize vandals and make the area more functional during evening hours. Will do some research on options.


New exit lights have been installed and are working, but new smoke alarms still need to be installed. Joe and Alex are still installing emergency lighting in the basement.

We are on the books for Bunge's power washing/tucking/sealing/caulking lime stone caps/chimney assessment-tear off, cost is \$13,790; they will knock off \$1,000 if we do this all at once. The council agreed to make an Endowment request for the funds.

Cookout and movie will be part of the dedication for the new playground around the end of August. The removal of the old playground equipment went well.

The photos on the church website need to be updated, also the donation button should be moved to the top.

Pastor Jeff has bought some internet repeaters to try to get wifi to the entire church.
