Sr. Citizen Dinner was re-scheduled to Thursday, March 27, 11 am. From the Pastor's Desk Dear Friends, would you please consider a few questions - If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why? When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most

like and what do you see in it that you most deplore? If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in twenty-five words or less?

Or - Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one memory that makes you happiest? Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for? If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

I imagine that you may experience these as tough questions, I know they are for me, and perhaps one or two of the questions you find off-putting or even offensive. These are the questions that Frederick Buechner suggests Christians ask themselves during Lent as he seeks to define Lent in his book "*Whistling in the Dark*".

He begins by saying, "In many cultures there is an ancient custom of giving a tenth of each year's income to some holy use. For Christians, to observe the forty days of Lent is to do the same thing with roughly a tenth of each year's days."

What if this year, rather than just thinking about what we might give up, we thought about Lent as being our offering God a tenth of our days towards a holy use. Buechner suggests that during Lent Christians ask, one way or another, what it means to be themselves. Who are you as a Christian? What does that mean to you? How does it affect and shape your identity? Your relationships? Your values? Your use of your time and resources? The journey through Lent can be a difficult one, it begins with Ash Wednesday and culminates in the events of Holy Week where we remember the final days of Jesus' earthly life and recognize the cost and sacrifice involved in discipleship.

Somewhere in this journey you may feel called to give something up or to take something on, but instead of that defining your journey allow that to emerge from your journey in consideration of your identity as a Christian. Prayerfully consider the questions above this Lent and should you become discouraged Buechner offers these words, "To hear yourself try to answer questions like these is to begin to hear something not only of who you are but of both what you are becoming and what you are failing to become. It can be a pretty depressing business all in all, but if sackcloth and ashes are at the start of it, something like Easter may be at the end."

<u>Ash Wednesday (March 5th)</u> begins the Lenten journey, and it is a time for us to acknowledge and confront our own mortality. As we look at our own mortality, we do so within the context of the promise of being raised to new life with Christ. <u>Worship will begin at 7:00 p.m.</u>

Forty Days is the length of Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday and concluding Holy Saturday. Sundays are not counted as a part of the forty days because each Sunday is a celebration witnessing the resurrection of our Lord. Lent is a time which calls us to a period of self-examination, reflection, and repentance. We are called to turn from the self-serving ways of the old life so that we may live a life reflective of the self-giving way of the cross. During that time we will meet on Wednesday evening for worship and a meal. We hope you will journey with us through Lent by attending any of these special worship experiences.
