Beginning in May - Masks Recommended but Not Required

As the infection rates in Vanderburgh and Posey Counties remain low, as of April 29th the infection rate according to the Indiana Coronavirus Dashboard is at 4.5% , the church council has decided to change its policy on mask wearing.

Beginning May 1st, we will continue to encourage and recommend wearing a mask at indoor gatherings but <u>NOT</u> require worship participants or those using the church for events to wear a mask. Please note that there will likely be those within the congregation both wearing and not wearing masks. We will ask that we continue to keep one row of pews open between guests gathering for our in-person worship services.


Merom Camp & Retreats

Church Giving and Donations


