Senior Citizen Dinner Thursday, May 15 at 11 am



It seems that Spring might finally have arrived. The signs are all around. Grass is growing



and needs to be mowed weekly. More and more bugs are out buzzing, and dandelions continue to burst out of the ground. To most people dandelions are weeds. They are botanical pests that are very hard to get rid of, but to most young children they are beautiful flowers that make wonderful bouquets. This reminds me of a profound piece of wisdom I learned long ago: Weeds are just plants that we have not found a use for

yet.

A weed is the term we use for unwanted plants. This says a lot about our perspective. Why do we value green grass over yellow fields of dandelions in our yards? Our collective dislike of dandelions says more about us than it does the plant, and I think there is a spiritual lesson hidden somewhere in there.

I am not the first one to notice this. There was a Christian band in the late 90's/early 00's called Five Iron Frenzy that sang about this in one of their songs appropriately titled, *Dandelions...* if you would like to listen here is a link... <u>Dandelions</u>

The song begins with telling a simple story that nearly every mother has experienced. A young child picks dandelions to lovingly give as a bouquet to his mother. The mother treasures these flowers, putting them proudly on display in a vase. In the chorus the lead singer crones, "She sees love where anybody else would see weeds."

In the next verse the song pivots to God. After singing about God's greatness and mercy the song lyrics question: "Where do I fit in this puzzle, what good are these gifts? Not a martyr or a saint/Scarcely can I struggle through/All that I have ever wanted, was to give my best to you." The song concludes: "Lord search my heart/Dandelions- You see flowers in these weeds."

When it comes to putting our faith into action, one of the reasons why we do not is because we are left wondering what kind of difference we will actually make. We see only limited results, we see inconsequential drops in a bucket, and we see what we think amounts to nothing more than weeds. However, dandelions are a reminder that not all weeds are useless. I know it is an obscure and unknown song, but Five Iron Frenzy was onto something. When we seek to make disciples, nurture disciples, transform the world, and serve God in love then God sees beautiful flowers. God sees love and obedience where others might see weeds.

In the kingdom of God there are no weeds, there are just people that have not found their purpose yet. There are so many ways that you can use unique passions, talents, and gifts to make the world a more loving, peaceful, and kind place. May you do that. May you not be afraid of failure, of being called out, or of not getting earth shattering results. I feel assured that whenever we humbly and earnestly seek to serve God, then God does see flowers in the weeds. Enjoy the landscape and blessings on your journey... *PJ*

- -AT&T will remove lines that have been hanging down



By request of Zion Council, here is a list of various ongoing benevolences you may donate to through Zion Lippe: (compiled April 2025 and published in May 2025 VOZ)

Regular Offering - (white envelope in offering boxes) goes in Zion General Fund for operating expenses. Loose Offerings not specified go to Regular Offering.

Building Fund - (blue envelope) goes in Zion Building Fund and generally used for larger/long term capital building or equipment projects at Zion Lippe. If you don't use numbered offering envelopes please put your donation in an envelope marked "Building Fund"

Second Mile – supports Medical Ministries in Honduras, donations collected at Zion Lippe are sent to IN/KY Conference of the UCC. Use yellow envelopes found at foyer bulletin board for 2nd Mile donations.

Partners in Food – mission of Zion Lippe to assist in food needs (primarily meat and canned goods) of numerous area food pantries and area organizations who provide meals. See Zion Annual Meeting Reports for more info. Place donations in an envelope marked "Partners in Food", make checks payable to Zion.

God's Storehouse Food Pantry – to make a monetary donation that goes directly to God's Storehouse Food Pantry located at St Peter's UCC on Hwy 66, make checks payable to Zion and place your donation in an envelope marked "Food Pantry" or "God's Storehouse". We distribute these donations quarterly to God's Storehouse.

Church World Service Blanket Fund, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), Neighbors in Need (NIN), Strengthen the Church and UCC Pension Board Christmas Fund are all special offerings of the United Church of Christ. See UCC.org for details of these mission projects and to make online donations directly through the UCC. Special Envelopes are provided at Zion at various times through the year for these offerings and donations are sent to IN/KY Conference of the UCC. Make checks payable to Zion.

If you make donations online through your bank or PayPal and wish your offering to go toward any of the above other than Regular Offering, please have the payer include a memo on the notification sent to Zion. Otherwise, all online donations are applied to Regular Offering.

Zion Endowment Fund, Zion New Cemetery Committee, Zion Sunday School and VBS, Women of Zion, Zion Youth Group, Zion Nursery Center and Operation Christmas Child all have their own separate bank accounts. Any donations to these groups should be given directly to them and checks made payable to those groups.
