
2023 Offering Envelopes

I have a petition that God will inspire and empower each of us to be not part of the problem but rather part of a solution which I believe is forever and always blowing in the wind, that wind which is the Holy Spirit of God. I have a petition that horrible diseases that take people from us too soon will be eradicated and cured. I have a petition that each of us would seek to understand others before judging them and still love them if views differ. And I have a petition that we will all recognize the truth the Franciscan monk Richard Rohr expressed when he wrote, "If we do not transform our pain, we will most assuredly transmit it."

Yet, at the same time, I do not want to neglect the second angel's basket, as we are all often tempted to do. I want to give thanks for a God who steadfastly refuses to give up on any of us—a God who is forever and always at work for good: forming, reforming, and transforming the world, the church, and every human heart. I want to give thanks for the privilege of being called—along with all my sisters and brothers—to be not passive spectators but active participants amidst the ongoing struggle for peace with justice in our personal relationships, our neighborhoods, and our world. I want to give thanks for the strength God graciously promises to us amidst that struggle. I want to give thanks for people who cook, serve, volunteer, pray, financially support, and dream of the future with hope and optimism.

Yes, I have my petitions, but I also have my prayers of thanksgiving ... and I hope you do too. But I also invite you to join me in offering those petitions and prayers of thanksgiving each and every day... and not just on the fourth Thursday in November.

Several Women of Zion ladies decorated the church for Harvest Season, collecting canned goods, any food items, or money for God's Storehouse for three Sundays in October.

Christmas will soon be upon us soon. Hanging of the Greens on November 27th, Blue Christmas on December 11th, Christmas Eve on Saturday, and Christmas Day which falls on Sunday this year, communion served.

Greeters are going well and people who let Rosie know if they can't be here on scheduled Sunday were able to be reassigned.

Big thanks to Pastor Jeff for always being there for us and we appreciate everything he does for us.

Sunday school is going well.

Completed property projects are new gutter installation, grease trap under the dishwasher has been cleaned out, the tuck pointing project, the boys basement bathroom, and the cross walk stripe being repainted.

New property projects are the door leading to the church furnace is blocked by something inside - we are working to determine problem. Row 2 or the overhead sanctuary lights did not come on Sunday and may be a circuit issue. And the pew pads need to be cleaned.

Open property projects are the shelter light installation, the office insulation, the basement formica, the handicap doors, repairs to the furnace room in the basement, and the North hoods on the SS hall vents need to be painted.

Tickets are \$30, \$40, \$50 for either session. We would get a 10% discount for 10 seats and a 20% for 20 or more.

Received a flyer from the Thunderbolts Hockey team about opportunities for outings but don't have details on anything yet.

Upcoming events are the Chili Cook Off, Trunk or Treat on the 30th and the United Caring Services want us to bring brownies on 30th, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

Hipp Nursery has some recommendations on trees for the playground project, there will be 3 to 5 trees planted and the Nursery will plant them, also we will be purchasing two more bags of rubber mulch to add as it settles or to replace. Once the trees are planted the playground project will be completed.








SENIOR FITNESS CLASSES @ ST. PETER'S UMC
