

<u>Confirmation</u> refers to the decision a person makes to respond to God's grace with intentional commitment, publicly reaffirming his or her baptismal vows before the congregation. Confirmation students are commonly youth in the 7th and 8th grade who learn about the meaning of Christian faith, the history and teachings of the United Church of Christ, and an explanation of the baptismal and membership vows they will ultimately be professing.

If you were in 7th grade confirmation classes last year we welcome you for your 8th grade year. If you are a 7th grader or know of someone in 7th grade that might be interested in confirmation, please let us know by contacting Pastor Jeff or by calling the office. Anyone older than 7th grade age who has not yet attended confirmation classes, but would like to attend now, please contact Pastor Jeff.

We are planning to begin Confirmation classes in October but will continue to monitor Covid developments over the next several weeks.

Note from the Pastor . . .

Many years ago a great sculptor unveiled his latest work to a large crowd. With a great flourish he swept off the cover, revealing a magnificent Angel, which would be one of many in the great church where it was to be placed. And what an Angel it was.

There was no wind in the sculptor's studio, yet the Angel's great wings seemed to be spreading as if to take flight. Marble can neither speak nor move, yet the Angel's mouth seemed to bless one and all, its hands folded in prayer.

The audience burst into applause. One person dared to ask the sculptor how he did it. "How do I do what?" came the reply. "How do you sculpt such beauty as this Angel?" "Oh that," he replied. "It's relatively easy. I just look at the block of stone and imagine the angel. Then I carefully chip away everything that doesn't look like an Angel."

Everything but the Angel. It sounds so simple. The reply seemed like a joke, but it was not. Great sculptors have this gift. They can see the figure that already exists within the block of stone and then use their tools to free what is extra, freeing the masterpiece. As the Creator, God is the artist and sees all the art that has ever been, and ever will be. By commanding us to be stewards, God tells us to become artists too, of our own souls.

Instead of a hammer and chisel, our tool is giving. Every time we give to the Church in whatever capacity that might be, it is like carving away a bit of marble revealing more of what our Church can and will be. Every hour volunteered at Zion Church, every extra effort given, every council meeting attended, every dollar given freely, every song sung in worship, and so on, does the same.

Our hands may lack the sculptor's skill, but through Christian stewardship, we can make our lives more beautiful than any statue. As we attempt to be faithful to the Gospel, may we be mindful of the sculpture that we continue to create through our actions, words, and visions for the future.


## Playground Renovation Donations Now Accepted
